Date for the Diary

29th April Bluebell Wood Service at Hill Farm, Gestingthorpe. All Welcome, please follow the signs in the village. Beautiful location.

Well spring has sprung and the migration into the garden has commenced with all the extra jobs that it brings. Unfortunately, with the spring season also comes seasonal crimes.

When working in the garden it is easy to get engrossed in what you are doing, if the house is empty it is wise to close and lock the door (don't forget the key though!). Put tools away after use, "it add insult to injury" if your tools are used to break into your house.

Be mindful of how you dispose of the packaging to new tools and lawnmowers; don't advertise it to the thieves and burglars with your empty boxes on display outside for roadside collection. Fold boxes inside out or break them up and put them in a bag for collection.

It's a good deterrent if your property is visibly security marked with your house number and post code such as www.creproducts.co.uk or labelled if a forensic property marking system is used such as www.smartwater.com or www.selectadna.co.uk. You can also record the serial numbers of any property free of charge at www.immobilise.com . If your property does get stolen with property marking and/or recording on Immobilise there is a greater chance of you getting it back.

With sheds coach-bolt and plate the padlock hasp sections to the frame and door, use a good quality "Close Shackle" padlock or a key operated mortice lock; don't forget the hinges, ensure they cannot be unscrewed. Protect windows with a wire mesh and fit a curtain or white wash the windows to prevent prying eyes. Consider a shed alarm if you do not have one, there are shed alarms available that contact you on the phone when activated and this is a clever device with many applications www.uwatch.co.uk . Products that are fit for purpose can found by looking for the "Secured by Design" or "Sold Secure" logos.

Larger plants can be secured to land or rootball anchors or plant through chicken wire covering the area with soil. Cement or bolt down containers to the ground. Your local garden centre or DIY store should be able to help.

The rogue trader also takes advantage of the fine weather to con the unsuspecting. Although you may think you would never be taken in by them they can be very convincing especially to the elderly or vulnerable, "I am laying some gravel up the road and see you need some....." "I notice your trees or shrubs need a prune..." so many stories. Look after the elderly or vulnerable near you and step in should you need to with a little advice, also another face sometime puts the rogue trader off. Need a trader and have no personal recommendations, look at

www.buywithconfidence for traders checked out by Trading Standards.

The Mothering Sunday service was held on 11th March. It was very well attended and 25 beautiful spring posies were distributed to the mothers present. Thanks to all who contributed flowers & made the posies.

The John Nott Charity

The John Nott Charity was created c1926 in Pebmarsh with the sole purpose of providing some financial support to widows and spinsters over the age of 55 years in the form of 1cwt of coal, distributed every Christmas.

John Nott did this by donating 2.1 acres of land off Water Lane for conversion into allotments. The income from the allotment rents provided the finance. Initially the annual rent was 2s 3d rising to 3 shillings in 1930. (one shilling was 5p in today's money). The rent remained at that value until 1961 when interest in the allotments disappeared. At its peak there were 33 plots rented out.

In 1961 the land was rented to one individual until 1964 to 2001/02 when the trustees decided to use the land to grow cereal crops by contract. The charity then relied entirely on donations for its income which was a struggle. In 2008 half the land was sold for affordable housing and the remaining one acre turned back into allotments. Income from the allotment rents and the interest from the invested sale proceeds have put the charity back on a sound footing.

Coal was going out of favour in 1984 and by 1997 the annual distribution became purely monetary and continues to be so. The charity is approaching 100 years old and thanks to our original benefactor, Mr John Nott, back in 1926 and the voluntary work of the trustees over the years our Senior Citizens of Pebmarsh are still able to benefit when the need arises.
