---

We are living through the greatest time of political and economic upheaval since the war, due to the Covid pandemic. It has changed in a fundamental way how we view the world, society around us and who we are.

Schools are still not open for the majority of pupils. There is no more popping to the shops...The state of our health is vital, and when we greet people with the question "How are you?" it is not just a polite exchange - we really are interested in the answer. Many of us are offering to help not just friends, family and neighbours, but also people who we do not really know very well, and somehow we don't mind a bit about the queuing for their drugs or shopping. Time seems elastic, and the pressure we previously created for ourselves with a busy social whirl is gone, and I, for one, feel better for it.

One of the biggest changes for me is the lack of a church service on a Sunday - it gave a focus to my week a chance to somehow press a "reset" button, where everything was somehow put into its proper place and a sense of proportion and peace reigned (at least for a short while!)

Since the lockdown started, we have missed many major festivals and celebrations - Mothering Sunday, Palm Sunday, Holy Week, Easter Sunday, Ascension Day, Pentecost and lastly Trinity Sunday. We have no other festivals until Advent which begins at the end of November. Of course, the importance of the Church is not just the building, but spirit of the Christian community which is part of it.

When you read this magazine, the Round Church at Little Maplestead and St Giles at Gestingthorpe will have been opened for private prayer, which is a step in the right direction. Why don't you take the time to drop in and share the peace of your lovely buildings - you never know what you might find there.....

### **Travellers In Great Maplestead**

---

On the evening of Saturday 13th June a group of travellers entered the village playing field and set up an illegal encampment. It is believed, although it cannot be proved, that the padlock on the access point (arrowed in photograph on next page) to the field through the telegraph pole security barrier surrounding the car park had been forced to gain entry.

This was extremely concerning for residents, particularly those living in close proximity to the site.

The Parish Council owns the playing field, so members of the Council were soon in attendance to both talk to the travellers' leader and also ask the people who had gathered to see what was going on to conduct themselves with restraint, keeping within the law. It was important to ensure that no attempts were made by residents to intervene and thereby possibly exacerbate what was a potentially volatile situation.

Two officers from the Essex Police Traveller Liaison Unit responded to a request to attend and made contact with the travellers that evening – the PTLOs also explained, to everyone present on Saturday night, what their powers were and what residents should and shouldn't do. Meanwhile the Council was already investigating the due legal processes that have to be followed in such cases to achieve a satisfactory resolution.

Intense activity throughout Saturday night and all day Sunday by members of the Council – and in particular the Clerk – involved contacting the Essex County Council leader and the Braintree District Councillor, liaising with the PTLOs, negotiating with the traveller group and investigating the procedures required to serve an eviction notice.

Matters were complicated in that the village school, in order to comply with its conditions of re-opening under the easing of the COVID-19 'lockdown', was making use of both the playing field and its car park as part of its required social distancing measures. While the field was being occupied, the school wouldn't have been able to open.

As it turned out, the presence of the school proved to be key to successfully resolving the situation: when the travellers were told that their presence on the field was going to have a detrimental impact on the school's operation they told the Liaison Officers that they did not want to stop children's education. As a result, they packed up and left the field on the Sunday evening.

The travellers had cleared up the site before they left, bagging most of their rubbish and leaving the field in a reasonably good state;

## More travellers in Great Maplestead

The Council would like to thank all those at the school, the councillors and residents who carried out a further clear-up operation on the Monday, which meant that the school was able to fully re-open the following day.

As a result of this incident, the Council is formalising a Traveller Policy which, when agreed, will be published on its website, making sure everyone is aware of the necessary legal steps that need to be taken to properly deal with and resolve such situations should they occur in future.

Naturally, improving the existing security of the Village Playing Field demanded a quick response from the Parish Council to ensure the immediate and future protection of the site so, as early as that Sunday morning, various solutions were being assessed. Consultations were had with experts familiar with the positives and negatives of various alternative security arrangements and consideration was also given to some of the more effective measures used in neighbouring parishes.

As a result the Council, under its COVID-19 Emergency Standing Orders and with the help of a small team of willing volunteers, was able to put into place enhanced security measures for the playing field on Friday 19th June, less than a week after the travellers' trespass.

Whilst these were the quickest and most effective interim measures to install, they have also been designed – and are intended to remain – a permanent feature. This will not, however, preclude further security enhancements being investigated, or implemented should it be considered necessary in future.

In carrying out this work the Council took into full account the need to ensure that parishioners and the school can continue to enjoy unfettered pedestrian and disabled access to the playing field – which is a precious village amenity – whilst allowing the car park to remain freely available for use by the school, visitors to the village and the community as a whole.

# Cycle Security

---

Cycle security is always an issue with thefts from a variety of locations including the town centre, residential areas, and educational establishments. Commonly bicycles are either not secured or not secured properly, and this makes it easy for thieves.

Where do they go? Number of places: - in a container abroad, to another part of the country, stored in premises or sold as either a cycle or cycle parts via the internet, or third parties.

By taking some appropriate precautions and using good quality security products, and using them well, should help you to keep your property safe. Use the best security you can afford. Don't secure a £2,000 bicycle with a £20 lock! As a guide look to spend 10-15% of the value of the item on its security. Look for a "Sold Secure" certified chain and padlock or "D - Lock" preferably gold rated but certainly not below silver. Consider what you chain it to whether at home or whilst out, is that secure? Is it well overlooked to provide good natural surveillance?

Make a note of the frame number, security mark the cycle, there are a number of different methods available such as [www.bikeregister.com](http://www.bikeregister.com), [www.datatag.co.uk](http://www.datatag.co.uk), and [www.retainagroup.com](http://www.retainagroup.com). Take a photograph of the cycle and any areas of damage or marks of identification, and some insurance companies may require one with the owner in the picture with it.

At home remove that first attraction to the thief or burglar: 1) don't leave garage doors open for long periods showing your expensive cycle and other property, 2) consider a "Ground anchor" or "Shed shackle" within your shed or garage to secure your cycle to, 3) look at your shed or garages security and ensure you have good locks and that the hinges are protected, 4) consider a shed alarm.

If you can its worth getting your children or grandchildren into good habits, keeping their bikes secure and not leaving them discarded on the front lawn or other, may save problems in the future.

Check with your insurance company to see what security standards they require for your insurance cover to be valid.
