Our buses

When leaving your car make sure you:

- Think about where you park and choose a safe place where people can see any activity.
- If using a public car park try and use a "Parkmark" car park <u>http://www.parkmark.co.uk/</u>.
- Don't leave valuables on display in the car, i.e. Sat Navs, cameras, expensive sunglasses, and money or designer clothes.
- Don't leave a bag on the seat, even if it only contains your gym stuff, the thief does not know that until he has damaged your car to find out.
- Clean the ring off the window left by the Sat Nav cradle or any other evidence of a removable electronic device being in the car.
- Be aware of those around you when you park, is someone watching you hide something away?
- Lock your car, and don't rely on the remote, physically check that it has locked even when on your driveway.
- Check your car is secure before you turn in of a night time in case a window was left open (it is also worth checking that someone has not left the interior light on, you don't want to come out to a flat battery).

Remembrance peal Gestingthorpe 27th April

Over 1400 associated bellringers lost their lives in action during the First World War. In St Pauls Cathedral London there is a book of Remembrance and a roll of honour in their memory

49 of these ringers came from Essex. Soldier Mr Ian Culham took on the great task of organising to ring a peal close to the centenary of their deaths. So far Ian has managed to ring in memory of everyone, all but two in their own church.

On Friday 27th April at Gestingthorpe Ian assembled a band of six ringers from across Essex and Suffolk to ring a peal in memory of Walter Nice of the Royal Engineers .

Walter from the Forge in Church Street is recorded as ringing over 14 peals across Essex.

He married Gestingthorpe school teacher Edith Downs in April 1917 he then returned to the frontline. In April 1918 at Arras he was wounded by a shot to the stomach and died in hospital at Dover on 29 April 1918, he is buried in a war grave in Gestingthorpe Churchyard.

The ringers led by Captain Alan Mayle completed the peal in 2 hours 53 min and were met afterwards by two of Walter's great nephews - Richard and Peter Nice.

Thank you to Mrs Alice Nolda for providing the ringers with their well deserved refreshments and a big thank you to the ringers themselves Alan Mayle, Neil Avis, George Thoday, David Salter, Ian Culham and Brian Meads.

Jude gave a brief history of how Age UK came into being when Age Concern amalgamated with Help the Aged in 2009. Age UK helped over 100,000 people in Essex in 2017, supporting people in their own homes after being in hospital, advice with filling in forms and often after Christmas when festivities are over and people become lonely after family and friends return to their own homes. Age Uk provide various home help services and they also provide the very useful "Message in a Bottle" and the "Life Book", in both cases the householder fills in their details on the pages provided which will enable emergency services to know about the person without having to question or search for the answers. Jane Stone warmly thanked Jude for an informative talk and for the free samples of the "Message in a Bottle" and the Guide of Services Essex Age UK provide.
