# **Letter from the Rectory**

This issue of the magazine brings to an end the series that we have been running since 2014 commemorating those from the four parishes who died during the First World War. Although, in May 1918, the war still had over six months to run, there were no more deaths in combat. However there were many deaths from wartime wounds in the years that follow, as well as those who lived with the mental and physical scars of that war for the remainder of their life. In the early years of the decade that followed the war churches and churchyards became the natural place to place war memorials and this is the case in all four of our churches, although Pebmarsh has a stand-alone memorial.

Our current Editor has put the words "Church and Community Together" on the cover of your Parish Magazine and this reflects the fact that the magazine prints both items of church news and from the wider community. In most parishes with ancient parish churches if is often said that the church has been at the heart of the community longer than any other institution. This is true of our parishes and the churches remain at the heart of the community. In many of our churches members of the community work week by week in supporting the church. This may be by flower arranging, cleaning, fund-raising or churchyard maintenance. We would like to take this opportunity to thank you all.

Also we are pleased to welcome people into the church for our events: craft fairs, flower festivals, BBQ's (actually happening in the church again) all of which are taking place this year. We also try to take "the church" out of the building a few times a year at our Plough Sunday and Bluebell services along with carol singing in the pub. This year we have a new addition, which you can read about elsewhere, a Doggie Walk in Great Maplestead to mark Rogation Sunday.

Lastly, we want to return to the starting point, later in the year we will be outlining the arrangements to commemorate the centenary of the end of World War One in our churches, but, through the fact that the churches are so old, they are also places to remember other events in our community life as well as your own memories. Please do use the churches and church yards as quiet places to reflect on such memories.

#### Lead roofs and metal thefts

It's not just old properties that are targeted by metal thieves, commercial and residential, rural and urban properties also attract their attention.

Check your roof regularly, better to discover something is amiss before a theft is added to by water damage.

We all need to work together and report any suspicious activity. Rarely will roofing contractors be working at night, people around buildings or on roofs using torch light, acting furtively, vehicles you don't normally see in that area or using that lane to an isolated property, are just a few that may be cause for concern – report on 101 or 999 if a crime is being committed. SEE IT REPORT IT.

If we don't help protect our heritage properties and churches there is real danger they could be lost for this and future generations.

I have listed below a few crime prevention tips in relation to metal theft:

- Make it difficult for the thief; where possible remove any climbing aids i.e. bins and ladders, plant prickly shrubs at possible climb points, make them walk a distance by securing gates and keep wheel barrows and wheelie bins locked away, keep sheds and outbuildings secure with good locks (see <a href="https://www.soldsecure.com">www.soldsecure.com</a>).and maximise surveillance by sympathetically cutting back shrubs and trees where possible.
- 2. Cultivate the neighbours to watch over your property.
- 3. Illusion of occupancy things like a light and radio left on inside.
- Consider using a forensic marker <u>suitable for roofs</u> (see <u>www.securedbydesign.com</u>) or a roof top alarm and possibly CCTV (see <u>www.nsi.org.uk</u> or <u>www.ssaib.org</u>),
- 5. Consider the use of anti-climb paints, but remember not below 2m and signage must be displayed.
- 6. If you use a non-lead roofing alternative put signage up to show you have done this.

Unlike a conventional bus, our F315 bus service requires some passengers to pre-book their seat and register as a customer at least two hours in a d v a n c e of travel using either 01621 874411 or bookings@essexandsuffolkdart.co.uk. These are passengers who wish to join the bus at Great Maplestead Church, Pebmarsh War Memorial or Pebmarsh Bus Shelter. These stops are shown in italics on the timetable.

All other stops will be served within a twenty minute window of the times shown below. (10 minutes either side). They do not require pre-booking.

This latest timetable (20 March 2018) is shown below.

There appears to be a discrepancy between the timetable published by Essex County Council and that used by the bus drivers. We are taking this up with David Finch our County Councillor.





# **GDPR – Protecting your Personal Information**

The new General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) comes into legal effect in the UK from 25<sup>th</sup> May 2018 and will affect all the organisations that you come into contact with from charities and not for profits (such as you local WI or dog club) up to the enormous multinationals. It is of particular concern to our Parish Councils.

The main changes concern how your *consent is obtained*: you must now explicitly 'opt in' to allow your personal data to be used, and it must be made clear to you, by the organisation requesting it, for what purposes your information is required. In addition, you will have the right of access to all data that an organisation holds about you.

You will also enjoy **new rights**, such as data portability and the right to be forgotten, and your data **must only be used for the purposes for which it was provided** – it must also be deleted when it is no longer needed for those purposes.

Precise information about how each **Parish Council** may use your personal data should be detailed in a **Data Privacy Notice**, which should be displayed on its website – a hard copy of this document should also be obtainable from the **Parish Clerk**.



#### The Rescue

If you live in Pebmarsh or have been driving through the village in the last couple of week you might have seen activity happening in the churchyard! This was because an old monument tomb fell into a vault, this left a very large deep hole in the churchyard. The first thing our Churchwarden Belynda Fellows did was to secure the site and order metal grids to go over the hole whilst the problem was solved. The Diocesan Archaeologist had to come and write a report, the Archdeacon had to be advised and of course no work or repair of significance in a church or churchyard can be done without a Faculty which is like the legal planning permission for the church. An interim Faculty or emergency temporary Faculty was applied for and granted within a couple of days.

But this was only part of the solution! How were we going to get this very large hole filled and how were we going to pay for it? The church struggles to pay its bills and does not have surplus amounts, we are already trying to find funding to repair the roof which is going to be very expensive and Jonathan Nott is starting up a Friends Group to help raise funds.

But Matt Gwinnell our local Funeral Director and Stonemason, who you may know better as Harvey Darke, or AR Clarke or Colne Valley Funerals, came to the rescue. Matt and his dad, as it is a family firm, went to the Churchyard, and said 'this is an emergency and dangerous, we will fill the hole for you and we will do it free of charge'. That is real commitment to our community and we are so grateful.
