# **Letter from the Reverend Beverley Vincent**

In the church, we look towards all that lies ahead in the next few months – Harvest Festival, All Souls, Remembrance Sunday, Advent and then, of course, the culmination of it all, Christmas!

But before we get to Christmas, we enter the season of autumn a time of thanksgiving. Maybe you want to give thanks to God for a lovely summer holiday, for weddings, for friends and family or for new beginnings.

# **Green Bin Charge**



The decision by Braintree District Council to charge for garden waste collections from March 2024 was discussed at a meeting of the Council's Scrutiny Committee on 1st August.

During the 2-hour meeting evidence was presented about the additional costs to residents relative to Cost-of-Living pressures, potential difficulties for some vulnerable



residents and a likely fall in recycling levels and more diversion of green waste to landfill, giving rise to more greenhouse gas emissions.

However, on a vote of 6-2 it was decided not to refer the Green Bin decision back to BDC's Cabinet, meaning the charge is now likely to be implemented.

In related news, the Government have now also decided to postpone a decision on new recycling regulations until after the next General Election...





#### F315 Bus Service Under Threat - Have Your Say...

The local F315 bus service is an important link to the outside world for residents with little or no access to private transport and who need to travel out of their villages for personal, social or work purposes.

**Essex County Council** is currently reviewing the future of its bus service provision, undertaking a **Public Consultation** into a strategy for 'Supported Local Bus Services 2024–2028'.

The **Consultation** covers **three service groups**, based on passenger volumes:

- The vast majority of services, where there will be no changes until at least 2028.
- An 'At Risk' group, which ECC will support until at least 2026 but where passenger numbers will need to increase.
- A 'Low Use' group, which appears not to be meeting local needs and therefore faces either major changes or a complete withdrawal.



The **F315** on-demand service between Halstead and Sudbury, that visits all the main villages in the four parishes covered by this magazine, is considered to be in the '**Low Use**' group and is being proposed for withdrawal. A possible alternative, Braintree's **Dart3** service, is also under threat – as can be seen from the Strategy Document extract below:

These services are being reviewed and consideration may be given to re-design them. For example, reducing frequency of days or times of operation, changing of routes, merging of services, replacing with an alternative service, implementing a devolution pilot, or withdrawing them.

Some of the villages in **Braintree District** are already designated as '**Tier 3**' in **BDC**'s **Local Plan**, meaning they are in a 'deprived area' of the rural district and therefore 'unsustainable through a lack of social infrastructure'. Loss of the **F315** service will only make this situation worse – with a resulting adverse impact on many parishioners.

Contrary to the Government's '**Levelling-Up**' agenda, withdrawing the bus service will inevitably:

- o restrict any future local village demographics just to car owners
- o be a disincentive for some families looking to move into the area
- increase the number and frequency of car journeys, substituting for those that would have been undertaken by bus
- have a greater detrimental effect on local air quality and consequently the rural environment in general
- o be a potential rationale for reducing the gritting of local roads in winter

#### **Nature Notes**

High summer is a time when views become limited. The roadsides are a riot of vegetation, so much so that you are in a tunnel and distant views are few. Good rain since late June has replenished reservoirs and restored lawns, which therefore demand frequent mowing. Many feel we haven't had much of a summer, but I think we are blessed compared with many parts of Europe that have suffered with extreme heat and fires.

The mistle thrush is the most elusive of our native thrushes, although it is quite common. It is larger than the song thrush and stockier, lacking the warm browns of the former and being greyer with larger spots. They are shy and normally seen in ones or twos but are known to form post-breeding flocks and I was lucky enough to encounter one of these in late July. There were 10 or 12 birds and I was alerted to them by their distinctive flight note, likened to a comb



being dragged over a piece of wood. In earlier times they were called storm cocks for their propensity to sing from high perches in wild weather, the song being loud and fluty.

On the 12<sup>th</sup> of August I heard a snatch of song that was unmistakably that of a willow warbler, a small warbler very like a chiffchaff but an uncommon breeder in our area. I never saw the bird but am confident in the identification. They are abundant the further north you go and are migrants, so I presume this was a bird already moving back south. A little research confirmed that they continue to sing, even once they have returned to Africa, although the song is less intense and somewhat curtailed. I once had a bright juvenile come through my garden in September, but that was the only other time I have recorded them in the patch.

The blockbuster moth event occurred in July, when I discovered a Pine Hawk-moth in my light trap. I regularly see seven species of Hawk-moth but had never (in over 7 years) had a Pine. It is not the largest, although still striking, and is not as colourful as most, but well-marked and distinctive. The caterpillars feed on pine but despite plentiful supplies of the food-plant, it is a scarce resident of Essex. The surprises keep coming.

# **Gardening Corner**

Now is the time for 'the harvest home' – there is nothing more satisfying than picking/digging your own produce.

I recently picked the last of my broad beans and, despite the dry weather, I had a decent crop. You can cut the old stalks off at ground level and leave the roots in the ground for a while. Being a nitrogen 'fixing' plant, the root system helps maintain good soil fertility. If you wish to weed and prepare the ground for a late crop I would suggest the following: winter cabbage, radish, chard or lettuce.

This month my suggested plant is Verbena bonariensis. It has a mauve coloured mop head of flowers and its long stem means it looks good at the back of a flower border. In the main it is self-supporting and complements grasses and other perennials.



Keep watering annuals in pots and hanging baskets – dead heading is essential, plus a weekly feed should see your plants looking good through to the end of September/beginning of October.

We're occasionally experiencing unseasonable high winds, so it's worthwhile checking that perennials are tied firmly to a stake. Plants like sweet peas need dealing with regularly as they have a thin stem and the tendrils are often not strong enough to provide sound support.

Side shoot Dahlias – this will give you larger flowers on longer stems but again tie the plants in, ideally to a cane.

Keep mowing the lawn at consistent intervals; put the mower blade up a setting, there is nothing worse than a scalped lawn. The grass will soon slow down considerably, growing at half the rate it did in May and June.

Just a reminder: spring flowering bulbs will soon be for sale in the garden centres – there is such a large variety to choose from we are spoilt for choice. Tulips really should not be planted until November but daffodils, hyacinth and iris can be planted from September onwards.


# Saturday 9th September, Autumn Show at Great Maplestead Village Hall.

# Playing Field Path - Going the extra mile...

Pupils and teachers from **St Giles' School** gathered on the last day of the summer term to 'officially' open the village playing field's **Coronation Path**, which will now double as a track for the children's '**Daily Mile**' exercise.

After 'cutting' the ceremonial ribbon, the entire school streamed onto the **0.2 mile** path that winds around the field for their inaugural 5-lap mile.





Completed in June as one of the final parts of the **Council**'s £110,000 playing field **Development Project**, the new path's cushioned rubber mulch surface reduces stress on joints when walking or running and has already been in regular use by residents as a convenient adult exercise facility.

By providing level, unobstructed access to all areas of the field, the path also enables everyone, of any ability – children, adults, walkers, runners, joggers and people with pushchairs or those using mobility aids, wheelchairs and mobility scooters – to fully enjoy this unique village amenity.

"We're delighted that **St Giles'** agreed to sponsor the playing field's **Coronation Path**, allowing the children to use it for their **Daily Mile**Page 15 of 40

exercise" said **Project Leader Simon Last**. 
# Heidi Page's Nature Watch (from Oak Farm)
