As an example below are 5 tips for a crime free Christmas.



- Don't leave Christmas presents or valuables in view of a window. Keep them out of sight from thieves. If you are storing items in a shed or outbuilding, secure them by fitting good quality locks and considering an alarm.
- If you're attending a Christmas party, make sure that you have considered how to get home in advance and don't use unlicensed taxis. Ensure you drink responsibly and are aware of your surroundings, whilst keeping your drink and belongings safe. For personal safety advice visit: www.suzylamplugh.org
- 3. Whether you're on an evening out, or Christmas shopping, keep your bags, handbags, wallets and mobile safe. Busy places make it easier for the sneak thief, so be alert at all times.
- 4. Record your valuables and property serial numbers by using www.immobilise.com - a free property recording website that helps the police identify owners of recovered property every day. On the site you can create a private and secure log of all your personal property including adding photographs.
- 5. After Christmas don't advertise your nice gifts to the thieves by putting the empty boxes out for collection. Disguise them, fold them inside out or put them inside other plain boxes.



News from St John the Baptist Primary School Remembrance

At 11 o'clock on Friday 9th November, our children participated in a minute silence to remember those who had fallen in both World Wars. The children were enthralled by Mr Martin Elms who played The Last Post on the bugle. At the War Memorial, after placing a poppy wreath on behalf of the school, pupils laid crosses for those who had lost their lives in World War 1. Pupils also read poems and prayers which had been written at school. As usual, pupils removed their own poppies and placed them by the War Memorial. Children read memories of family members who lost their lives or who experienced wartime. Mr Lee Ivatt, one of our parents, kindly drove his WWII, 6 wheel drive, American army truck, for the children to see. It had been used in the Battle of the Bulge, the Battle of Remagen Bridge and the Liberation of Prague to name but a few. The children were able to ask Mr Ivatt questions about it before returning to school. We were also able to view an American WW2 Jeep complete with motor cycle.

Harvest Gifts

As a diocesan school, we were invited to send a box of locally grown produce to Chelmsford Cathedral for the County Harvest Festival. Thanks to the artistic talents of one of our parents, our box was presented most beautifully and had 'centre stage' both at Little Maplestead Flower Festival and the County Harvest Festival in Chelmsford Cathedral. After the service all the food was put to good and practical use to support people in the locality.

An Important Letter from Lt. Maplestead Church Council.

The PCC have been working for many months on a new proposal for a small Parish Room. The proposed location, for the building is for it to be adjacent to the existing toilet in the grounds of the Round Church. This is not a new idea; 10 years ago plans were drawn up for a building which provided a Tea Point, Store room and Toilet. In 2013, with the assistance of the Parish Council, a limited funding opportunity arose that allowed the toilet portion of this building to be built.

The church is the only building in the village which can be used by the community and although we are very lucky to have such a wonderful church, it has many challenges; for instance, I'm sure many of you appreciate the amount of effort it takes to provide refreshments at events with just a stand pipe for water and trestle tables for a kitchen!

The main purpose of the Parish Room is to support the church's mission, but it will always be secondary and subservient to the main Church building, both in its appearance and also its purpose. It will provide a flexible open space, that as well as supporting the Church's mission will also be able to be used by the whole community for other small events.

The proposed location of the Parish Room, is for it to be located in the northwest corner of the churchyard and for it to be connected to the existing toilet building; in plan it is 'T' shaped. The main part of the building will be situated along the western boundary and will measure 4m deep and just over 6m long. From the main structure, the east elevation will extend 4m beyond the existing toilet building towards the church; this part will be just over 5m wide. Glazing has been proposed for the east elevation to give a vernacular view of the church. The store room will be placed out of the way, behind the toilet building.

The PCC, their building surveyors and the DAC architects, have looked into a number of alternative proposals but believe this has the least impact on the surroundings whilst providing a flexible useable space. The proposed location has been selected to ensure the room is as far away from the church as possible so the views of the church from the main entrance are unaffected. The design has been chosen to keep the ridge height as low as possible as this is a significant factor to ensure the Parish Room is subservient to the Church.

In addition to working closely with Oswicks, our Building Surveyors, the Diocese of Chelmsford Advisory Council and their architects, the PCC have also engaged with Braintree District Council, Heritage England, as well as St. John's Ambulance as they have a long historic connection with the church.




