Letter from the Rectory

This year the calendar does not seem to be playing fair with Lent. Firstly Ash Wednesday fell on Valentine's Day, which led to the Pope saying that this did fall into the Lenten period and thus, for those following a strict programme of Lenten fasting, any meat was off the menu of any romantic meal. The second clash is that Easter Sunday falls on all fools day. One immediate question is "should our Easter message appear in this issue of the magazine or the next"? As you cannot have Easter Sunday without the events of Holy week the answer has to be that the message should appear this month.

At Little Maplestead, with the help of the Friends, we are looking at applying for additional grants to assist with the funding of the ongoing repairs to the church. As some of these grants relate to the windows we have had to take a close look at them. At Little Maplestead the windows are decorative in the round section of the church and the nave.

However the four windows in at the East end do tell a story. A story that starts with Jesus's betrayal by Judas in the garden of Gethsemane and ends with his rising from the dead on Easter morning. Therefore Sunday by Sunday the congregations have been reminded of those basic truths of the Christian faith, that the baby born at Christmas grew up to be a man who did suffer as we might suffer. During those days of Holy week we see a man who has doubts, a man who has an unfair trial, a man who is tortured and like all of us a man who dies. Then the story takes an unusual twist on Easter Sunday Jesus is seen alive by his followers, those are the facts of the story as they might appear in a history book.

For Christians however this is not a history lesson. What happened at Easter is at the core of our beliefs. Every week we proclaim that through the events of Easter Jesus has conquered death and that death is no longer something to be feared. It is the events of Easter that bring into focus Jesus' teaching on prayer and doing good works – indeed it is Easter, and only Easter, that makes us Christian. The simple truth is that without Easter there would be no church. This is no April fool's story. Over Easter there are plenty of opportunities to explore that Easter story please join us during our Easter journey.

Farmhouse Burglary Advice

After a successful few days giving crime prevention advice at this year's Doe Show I thought it was a good time to tailor this month's advice to our rural communities.

Houses in residential areas and isolated areas are equally at risk to burglary and the farm house is no different. The isolated residential house is likely to be empty during the day whilst the owner travels to a city to work, the farm house empty while you work on the land, and not surprisingly most burglaries occur during the daytime.

In some cases farmers like many others believe it won't happen to them "My parents never locked their doors when they went out and I never had a problem" unfortunately times are a changing. I have called at a farm house before now on a prearranged appointment to find no one in and the front door open, moments later a car arrives, they have just dropped a child at school "never thought about shutting the door". It could be said that it would appear that someone is in, but do you want to chance it, and there is strong possibility that your insurance would not pay out for any loss!

There are some things you can do to reduce the risk of being a victim of burglary, here are ten tips to be going on with:

- Ensure that you have good British Standard locks on your windows and doors, look for the Secured by Design and Sold Secure accreditation too.
- Shut and lock all windows and doors whilst out of the house.
- Put all tools outside away A burglar prefers to use yours than bring his own.
- Consider an intruder alarm either self-monitored or by a certified receiving centre, some can even be linked to CCTV viewable from mobile phones.
- Where possible fence and gate the rear with fencing and gates at least 1.8m, lock the gate too.
- Especially where the public have access to the farm display rule setting signage to tell visitors where they are not welcome.
- **External lighting** Permanently light the house frontage with energy efficient lighting activated by a dusk till dawn sensor. Other areas can be manually lit or PIR activated. If no one overlooks
- With the dark nights **create the illusion of occupancy** with lights on timers in rooms you would normally be in. Leave a radio on, there is a fake TV that flashes lights resembling a TV being on.
- Have a safe and lock your valuables in it, failing that with jewellery have two jewellery boxes, one with sacrificial jewellery (needs some good stuff) on display and hide the rest.
- **Don't forget your firearms**, don't risk someone getting their hands on them and you losing your licence always lock them away in a suitable cabinet.
- Security mark your property with your post code and house number or first three letter of your house name, there are also a number of "forensic" marking solutions available. With IT activate or download security and tracking programs. Take photographs of treasured property with a scale included.

News from the Rectory

On Friday the 16 February The Bishop of Chelmsford made a visit to our parishes. He was at St. Giles Gt. Maplestead but it also related to Gestingthorpe. We also had two other people from the Diocese, a Sunday Telegraph photographer, a Sky photographer, the Sky helicopter, a reporter and County Broadband and the churchwardens for Gt. Maplestead, Nick and myself. Why? Well that was the mystery because we were not allowed to know until Sunday the 18th when the church of England announced that it had signed an agreement" with the Government to simplify the process for using church buildings to host wi-fi for the local community.

The Church of England chose the Diocese of Chelmsford to launch this event and the Diocese chose us because they said it was important and we had been instrumental in what was happening. It was quite exciting being on the top of the tower waiting for the helicopter to arrive from Kent. Gay has to admit she did not enjoy the climb up the tower ladders and back down. But what was very apparent was the importance which the church is now taking to communicate to our modern world. And when the journalist asked the Bishop, do you think God would approve how the churches are being used for this, the Bishop asked. 


